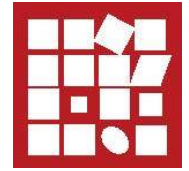


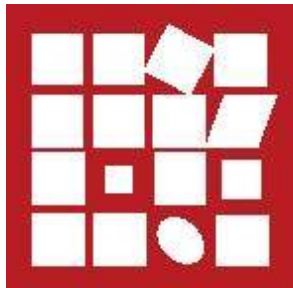

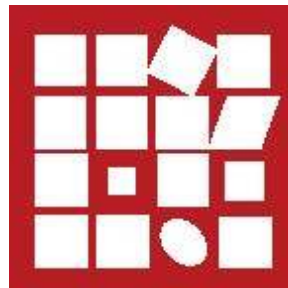

THE 4-YEAR TRAINING PROGRAM IN CONTEMPORARY PSYCHOANALYSIS

Classes commence September 2012 • Monday Evenings 7:00 – 10:00 p.m. • classes held at the University of Toronto

The TICP offers an intensive four-year program that balances professional training and scholarly education. The course of study is structured to be comprehensive, intellectually rigorous, and clinically relevant. The curriculum reflects a comparative/integrative perspective, exploring and contrasting theoretical positions and the scientific/philosophical assumptions inherent in them, attending to the historical context in which theories developed. The educational philosophy aims to develop the ability to think critically about the major points of view in psychoanalytic theory and to formulate clinical material from diverse, mutually enhancing viewpoints.

CLINICAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Three Control Cases – each are required to be seen in treatment at least three times per week:

Case 1 requires minimum **80** hours (once per week) supervision;

Case 2 and *Case 3* require minimum **40** hours (once per week each) supervision.

2. Completion of a Scholarly Paper.

PERSONAL THERAPY

All candidates must demonstrate that they are working actively on any personal issues that could influence their ability to provide optimal treatment to their patients.

PROGRAM FEES

The current tuition fees are \$3,500 for active candidates. This includes participation in all Weekend Workshops and Scientific meetings. These fees can be paid in full or in two installments.

GRADUATION

Upon completion of all academic and clinical requirements, the Candidate Progress Committee will take into consideration reports from instructors, clinical supervisors, and external readers to determine a candidate's eligibility to graduate. Successful candidates will be recommended and approved by the TICP Executive Committee. Graduates may refer to themselves as Psychoanalysts. Graduates are awarded a Diploma, membership in the Toronto Society for Contemporary Psychoanalysis, and have the opportunity to be involved in numerous international psychoanalytic organizations with which the TICP is affiliated.
